当设备不是长时间使用时,请按照下面的步骤将后面板上的主电源开关设置到关闭位置。

- 1. 按住前面板上的STANDBY/ON按钮, 本设备进入 待机状态。
- 2. 将后面板上的主电源开关设置到关闭(O)位置。
- 主电源关闭后, STANDBY LED保持亮灯, 这是因 为在停电时短期功率保持使用。当备用电源耗尽 时, STANDBY LED会熄灭。


